Classroom Expectations

Criteria for assignments will be developed with your input and all work will be assessed using the following scale:

5 - A Excellent achievement

 met all the criteria, demonstrates a full understanding of the tasks, finished product presented in a neat, precise manner - excellent quality

4 - B Very good achievement

 almost all of the criteria met, demonstrates a good understanding of the tasks, activities presented in a neat, clear manner - very good quality

3.5 - C+ Good achievement

 most of the criteria met, demonstrates a fair understanding of the tasks, activities presented in an acceptable manner - good quality

3 - C Satisfactory achievement

 only a few of the criteria met, demonstrates a partial understanding of the concepts, activities presented demonstrate a lack of organization - satisfactory quality

2 - I Incomplete achievement

 not yet met the criteria, demonstrates lack of understanding of activities, little or no effort to present activities - unacceptable quality
